IE0001	S. Lewis, Topographical Dictionary of Ireland, 1837	Lewis's Topographical Dictionary of Ireland is the first detailed study of its kind for Ireland. It was published in 1837, before the Famine (1845-50), so it is very important for historians and genealogists of the early nineteenth century.	€39.74
IE0002	Pettigrew & Oulton, Dublin Almanac & General Registry of Ireland, 1845	This publication contains two major components. IE0003	H.D. Inglis, A Journey Through Ireland, 1834	This book was considered to be one of the most important early nineteenth century commentaries on Ireland. Inglis was a Scottish travel writer and social commentator who published many books concerning various countries worldwide. This was his last title, as he died the following year. He visited the majority of counties in Ireland, and provides a wealth of information on the social conditions he observed in each location. Even though he travelled in a non-Famine year, the depth of poverty he witnessed was acute. For social historians and genealogists his work is especially useful, providing a eye-witness account of the real life conditions experienced by the general population of Ireland at that time. He also has a lot to say about the consequences of Catholic emancipation, and religion in general. His book is essential reading for anyone trying to understand Ireland in the 1830s.	€14.83
IE0004	Alumni Dublinenses	A register of the students, graduates, professors and provosts of Trinity College, in the University of Dublin from 1637 to 1846. With over 300 names from 1593-1637 when there are no surviving registers. Trinity College Dublin is the oldest university in Ireland, and this register includes the full name, the date they entered the college, their age at entry, their father's name and address, the degree they received and the date they graduated. Other information about their lives is often included. Students at Trinity College came from all over Ireland, Britain, and the British Empire.	€24.79

IE0030	Sir Jonah Barrington, <i>The Rise and Fall of the Irish Nation</i> , 1833	Originally published in 1833 by James Duffy, Sir Jonah Barrington's <i>Rise & Fall of the Irish Nation</i> , treats on the political machinations and backroom deals that led to the passing of the Act of Union of Great Britain and Ireland in 1800, from the highpoint of Henry Grattan's achievements in 1782. As a participant and anti-Unionist, Barrington's views, although tempered by his legal calling, are somewhat biased. Nevertheless, his account of the bribery and corruption that led up to the final vote make for fascinating reading and his publication of the Black List – all those who voted for the Union – and the patronages, titles and cash they received for their vote must be read. IE0043	Deserted Children (Dublin) 1854	Deserted Children (Dublin) is a small Statistical Report made to the House of Commons regarding children deserted in Dublin for the periods June 1850 to June 1854 who came into the care of the Dublin Metropolitan Police. The Report details the cases of about 500 deserted children, some of who remain nameless, the circumstances of their desertion and fate within the social system as it existed in Dublin in the first half of the 1850s. IE0044	HMC, Report on Franciscan Manuscripts preserved at the Convent, Merchant's Quay, Dublin, 1906	Published in London and Dublin in 1906 from a report to the Houses of Parliament by the Historical Manuscripts Commission, the Report on Franciscan Manuscripts details the manuscripts that had survived from the established of the Irish Franciscan College of St. Isadore in Rome especially those detailing communications with its first Guardian, Luke Wadding. These manuscripts have since been known as the 'Wadding Papers'. These manuscripts were transferred from Rome to Dublin in 1872. Much of the correspondence contained in the MSS date from the foundation of St. Isadore's in 1625 and a vast majority details communications with Wadding concerning the onset of the Irish Rebellion of 1641. Many of Wadding's correspondents, such as Dr. Edmond Dwyer and Hugh Bourke were remarkably well informed about events in Ireland and England. Real Life in Ireland follows the hilarious misadventures of the Irish caricatures, Brian Boru and Sir Shawn O'Doherty as they experience all that the high and low life of Dublin had to offer in the 1820s. Containing topographical and geographical descriptions of the Upper Lough, King's edited publication greatly benefits from the plethora of additional genealogical and biographical material provided by King as well as some very interesting appendices, which included officers and men of a number of Fermanagh Regiments dissolved in 1698 as well as a list of Crown tenants of the county dating from 1678. Written by one of the participants of that Rising, the Felon's Track paints a vivid account of the events and people involved in the Rising. IE0050	Sir Charles Gavin Duffy, <i>Young Ireland, A Fragment of Irish History, 1840 - 1845, 1884</i> .	First published in 1880, the People's Edition of Sir Charles Gavan Duffy's <i>Young Ireland: A Fragment of Irish History, 1840-1845</i> , was published in Dublin in 1884. Republished here on fully searchable CD-Rom, <i>A Fragment of Irish History</i> was Duffy's first account of the events dominated by the politics of Daniel O'Connell and his attempt to repeal the Act of Union with Britain. It was O'Connell who labelled Duffy and others such as Thomas Davis and John Mitchel who coalesced around <i>The Nation</i> newspaper as <i>Young Ireland</i> , preferring to identify himself as 'Old Ireland'. As one of the central contemporary commentators as well as one of the chief protagonists of the cataclysmic events that led to the 1848 Rising, Duffy's <i>A Fragment of Irish History</i> is a must read for anyone interested in the slightest with the political events in Ireland immediately before the Famine, events that Patrick Pearse would later record as one of the motivating factors for his later actions.	€14.83

IE0052	Report of the Labour Commission to Ireland 1921	Published in 1921 by the English Parliamentary Labour Party, the Report of the Labour Commission to Ireland, although a relatively brief publication of just 124 pages, is a thoroughly fascinating, if sometimes a little biased, account of the War of Independence, especially the conduct of the British Army and Auxiliary Forces. The Report gives in some minute detail the findings of the Commission, which took place after the British Government had refused to conduct an independent inquiry in Ireland along the same lines. The Commission's Report is replete with many photographs of material damage incurred during the War, especially in areas of north Co. IE0053	The American Commission on Conditions in Ireland, Evidence on Conditions in Ireland	Published in May 1921, Evidence on Conditions in Ireland, Comprising the Complete Testimony, Affidavits, and Exhibits Presented Before the American Commission on Conditions in Ireland, Transcribed and annotated by Albert Coyle, Official Reporter to the Commission, represents the oral and written testimonies of Irish, American and British witnesses before the Commission and as such is the published account of the complete evidence submitted to the American Commission on Conditions in Ireland during the Irish War of Independence. Containing the verbal testimony of 41 witnesses from Ireland, Britain and America and presented in 1120 pages of text, this published account of eyewitness evidence is possibly the best single primary source on the subject.	€19.82
IE0054	Report by the Select Committee on Pawn Broking in Ireland, together with minutes of Evidence, an Appendix and an Index, 1838	Republished here is the <i>Report by the Select Committee on Pawnbroking in Ireland; Together with the Minutes of Evidence, Appendix and Index</i> , which was first published in Dublin by Alexander Thom in 1838. The inquiry into pawnbroking in Ireland came out of concerns being aired in the national press that pawnbrokers in general were charging extortionate and illegal rates of interest for monies lent by them on amounts of two shillings and less and this had brought the entire trade into disrepute.
